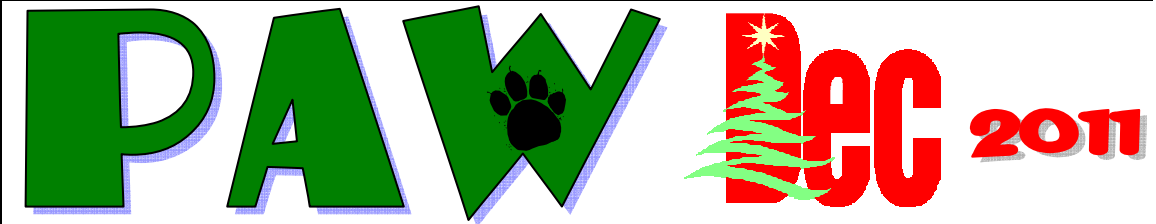

The Lynnwood Campus, including all Early Childhood-Daycare (Preschool & Pre-kindergarten) Programs, will follow the announcements for the Edmonds School District. You can also listen to these RADIO & TV stations:

**KCMS (105.3FM), KCIS (630AM), KIRO (710AM), KING (98.1FM)
KOMO (1000AM)**

The following announcements may be made: **open on time; open late; no school.**

The TV stations can take up to 45 minutes after the announcement is called in to actually have it on the air. When school opens late, transportation will operate late. When school opens more than one hour late, there will be NO A.M. Preschool/Pre-Kindergarten/Kindergarten.

- ✧ **POLICY CHANGE FOR PRESCHOOL/PRE-KINDERGARTEN: When the Edmonds School District announces school closure due to inclement weather, Cedar Park Schools and the Preschool/Pre-Kindergarten will also be closed. This policy change now includes Childcare. PLEASE make arrangements now for care by a family member or arrange a play date to accommodate your schedule when a snow day is decided. If there is no announcement, school will be open. We may need to dismiss school early if the roads remain icy or the weather becomes worse.**

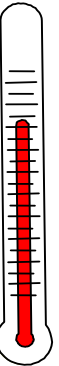
PARKING LOT CONCERNS

- Who are the privileged ones who get to pick up in the lane closest to the building? That is right – only those with K-1st graders.
- Are your children safe in the crosswalks? Only if cars do not cross over the lengthwise crosswalk.
- Should you turn south out of the north exit lanes? Only if you want to chance crumpled metal on the side of your car.
- How can we avoid having a police officer come and hold our hand to avoid a back-up on 64th Avenue at dismissal? We need to be obedient to the teachers' request to have you move forward over the speed bump. Your children will be brought to you at the front of the parking lot.
- Is your child dressed, packed up and ready to exit when you pull into the lot? All that's left to do should be quick good-bye kisses and hugs.
- Morning drop-off would be smoother if the kindergarten parents dropping off in the lane closest to the building would pull up to the speed bump before allowing the child to exit the car over the curb.
- **Remember** ~ the North lot is only for parking and walking your child across and into the courtyard, not for dropping off.

HEALTH INSTRUCTIONS

Bringing a child to school with any of the symptoms below puts other children and staff at risk of getting sick. If all parents keep their sick children at home, we will have stronger, healthier, and happier children.

- ❑ Appearance, Behavior – unusually tired, pale, lack of appetite, difficult to wake, confused or irritable. This is sufficient reason to exclude a child from school.
- ❑ Eyes – thick mucus or pus draining from the eye or pink eye.
- ❑ Fever – temperature of 100 degrees Fahrenheit or higher.
- ❑ Greenish Nose Discharge, And/Or Chronic Cough – should be seen by a health care provider. These conditions may be contagious and require treatment.
- ❑ Sore Throat – especially with fever or swollen glands in the neck.
- ❑ Diarrhea – 3 or more watery stools in a 24 hour period especially if the child acts or looks ill.
- ❑ Vomiting – vomiting 2 or more times within the past 24 hours.
- ❑ Rash – body rash, especially with fever or itching. Heat rashes and allergic reactions are not contagious.
- ❑ Ear Infections Without Fever – do not need to be excluded, but the child needs to get medical treatment and follow up. Untreated ear infections can cause permanent hearing loss.
- ❑ Lice, Scabies – children may not return to school until they have been treated and are free of lice and nits (eggs). Children with scabies can be admitted after treatment.



**IF YOUR CHILD SHOWS ANY OF THE ABOVE SYMPTOMS AT SCHOOL,
IT WILL BE NECESSARY FOR YOU TO PICK HIM/HER UP FROM SCHOOL.**

If children are well enough to be at school, they do have to go outside at recess time.

Just remember to dress your children in warm clothes. **Only those children who bring a note from a doctor excusing them from outside recess may stay inside.**

Remember to practice good hygiene such as hand washing, avoid touching eyes/nose/mouth, covering mouths when coughing or sneezing and throwing away all used tissues.
