OVERVIEW

ADMISSION GUIDELINES

CALCULATION OF GPA

All secondary grades are based on an A to F, 4.0 scale. Honors course grades are not weighted. Cedar Park Christian School does calculate rank and transcripts do include a cumulative GPA. All secondary classes taken for credit (transfer or Cedar Park Christian School credits) are factored into the cumulative GPA.
