Locker Assignments

Each student will receive an assigned locker to use during the school year at no extra charge. Each class has a pre selected bank of lockers, with the Junior High located on the lower level and the Senior High in the upper level of the school building. Please follow these steps in obtaining a locker.

1. Each student needs to provide a 7mm 9/32" combination lock (no key locks allowed), Master Lock is suggested. Students **must** keep lockers locked.
2. Locker assignment will occur when the student brings a lock and provides the office with its combination. Students should practice opening lock at home.
3. Students must note any damage that is present on the locker when they turn in their locker card to the office.

Fall Sports

HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS begin **Monday, August 22rd**. **Prior to participation, you must have** the following forms turned into your coach or the athletic department: "Permission to Participate" and "Concussion Information Sheet".

Also, you **MUST** confirm, with the athletic department, that you have a current physical. It is good for **two** years. The \$170 athletic fee for high school / \$140 for junior high is due, September 2nd. Ten practices are mandatory in order to be eligible to participate in a game, so it may be necessary to initially have a couple of Saturday practices.

There is a mandatory parent/player meeting on Thursday, September 1st at 6:00 pm in the gym, right before our Back to School night at 7:00pm, in The Den. This is a critical meeting for everyone participating in Fall sports to attend, to hear the same thing, at the same time and in the same way.

HS Boys Soccer: Practices will be held at Ballinger Playfield (23000 Lakeview Drive Mountlake Terrace, WA 98043) from 3:15-5:00. Transportation to the field will be provided to the facility beginning August 29th but the players need to be promptly picked up by their parent or guardian at 5:00.

BE READY: This means cleats/shin guards are on and you are ready to warm-up at 3:15. **Bring lots of WATER! No shooting or long passing before we warm-up (this is not good for your muscles).**

THURSDAY: We will practice as usual at Ballinger and then head over to the Patterson's home for a BBQ (4801 – 219th St. S.W., MLT, 98043. 425.776.5704). We will officially **be done at 5:30**. Feel free to stay later if desired.

HS Volleyball: For the week of August 22rd, practices will be held from 4:00-6:30, there will be separate conditioning from 11:00am to 1:00pm. The first week of school, practice will be 4:30-7:30, no other conditioning. Starting the week of Sept. 5th, practice will be from 4:30-6:30 on non-game days.

JUNIOR HIGH SPORTS (6th-8th grades) begin **Monday, August 29th**. **Prior to participation, you must have** the, "Permission to Participate" and "Concussion Information Sheet" forms turned in to your coach or to the athletic department and confirmed, with the athletic department, that you have a current physical. (Please refer to the links listed above.) It is good for **two** years. The \$140 athletic fee needs to be paid by Friday, September 2nd.

JH Soccer: Practices are **held at our Lynnwood Campus** (17931 - 64th Ave. 98037) from 3:15-5:00. Transportation to practice will be provided but the players need to be promptly picked up by their parent/guardian at 5:00.
