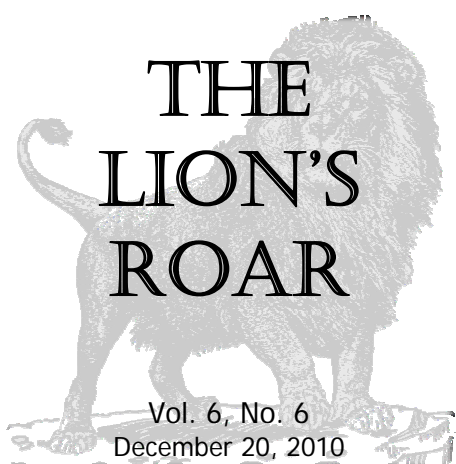

Lady Lions Race to First Win

The Cedar Park Lady Lions Basketball Team secured their first win of the season versus Shorewood Christian in the homecoming game by a score of 46-36. The young Lions started quickly, scoring the first 14 points of the game and were never headed in the non-league match.

Junior Jess Castor led the Lions with 14 points and 14 rebounds before fouling out. Senior Jenna Otis got off to a fast start with six first quarter points but saw very limited playing time due to foul trouble. With the only two upperclassmen out of the game the 8th and 9th graders were able to withstand a furious Shorewood charge and even widen the lead.

Outstanding play by Sarah Dressler (13 points and nine steals), Leanna Mapel (nine rebounds), Britt Jacobsen (eight points and eight rebounds), Brianna Joki (four points) and great defense from Carolina Jimenez led the way to the homecoming victory.

Varsity Boys Basketball

The Boys Varsity Basketball team has been playing well as of late (except for a slip up at LaConner). Brent Reidt and Alex Nasa have been leading the Lions in scoring with quality rebounding from Daniel Schettler and Brent Reidt. The Lions take on Mt. Vernon Christian this Saturday at 2:00pm in the Lions Gym. "For the most part the guys have been working hard and playing hard. We really need to focus on the little things and gaining a better understanding of what it means to execute when facing a strong team." said Coach Russell. As the boys look forward to break, they play a Christmas tournament in Mt. Vernon on Wednesday the 29th against Seattle Lutheran at 3:30, and on the Thursday the 30th against Lummi Nation at 3:30. "The Mt. Vernon tournament will be a good time for us to work on some things. The two teams are polar opposite in their style of play and should help prepare us for our league games when we return to school in January."
