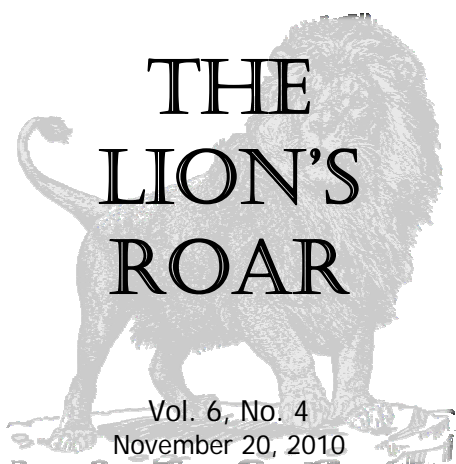

The Library Corner

This high school campus has a really great library. Do you know where it is?



Right behind the flag pole is the building that houses the Cedar Park Mountlake Terrace Campus Library.

What makes it great? The library has a very large fiction, non-fiction, and video selection.

We have many classics authors such as Dickens, C.S. Lewis, Dumas, Steinbeck, Tolstoy, and Mark Twain. Numerous series authors and Christian authors such as Bodie and Brock Thoene, Ted Dekker, Frank Peretti, Sigmund Brouwer, Nathaniel Hawthorne, Francine Rivers (and the entire The Lineage of Grace Series), Lori Wick, and Grace Livingston Hill.

Because of the specific interests of past teachers we have a very large collection of non-fiction books about World War II and Early American History. Also, many books based on the U. S. Constitution, Northwest plants and gardening, cookbooks, poetry, and plays.

Our video collection is mostly the VHS format with a spattering of DVD's. And lastly, we have a very large biography collection. Most likely we have the biography your student needs for that assignment.

I would like to invite parents to check out books from our library. I can easily assign you a library account and get you going. We are attempting to encourage the students to visit and use our library with the help of you and our teachers.



It is important for the students to learn and understand how to look up a book or research an item. The libraries online public access catalog (OPAC) is being added to each library computer so that students can easily search a subject or keyword of what information they need. These skills are very important as they progress into the college life.

Lastly, I am working on networking with Sno-Isle here in Mountlake Terrace, to help students with homework and resources. This is still in the works and I will keep you updated. Library hours at present are Tuesday's and Thursday's 10:00 am – 3:00 pm. I am there at this time. Books can be checked out afterschool as well. There is a clip board at the checkout desk. Just write your name, library item barcode, and your phone number (parents this would help me.)
