Philosophy:

Our IS homeschool support program embraces the general philosophy of Cedar Park Christian Schools, addressing its educational practices from a Christian perspective by offering students the opportunity to understand themselves and the world around them from a Christian worldview.



Purpose:

The purpose of the homeschool program is to train students to serve the Lord by setting high, yet realistic academic goals and standards of conduct. The program is designed to assist parents in the teaching of their children and to help guide their students through the educational process.

Curriculum:

Parents may select from a number of Christian curriculum resources such as Bob Jones, A Beka, ACSI, and Alpha Omega. The family is responsible for purchasing curriculum. Saxon and Shormann math (on-line) are typically used. Monarch Bible and Spanish are also popular curricular choices. A variety of options for Occupational and Fine Arts Education are also available.



Benefits:

- *Helps to establish individual educational plans with each student.
- *Provides Christian, certified teachers as academic advisors.
- *Offers extracurricular activities at CPCS: sports and clubs.
- *Offers up to two classes on one of the CPCS secondary campuses.
- *Provides on-campus standardized achievement testing.
- *Provides resource support.
- *Reviews goals and academic accomplishments.
- *Helps to create individualized educational programs: mentoring, fine arts, occupational education, work-study and career options.
- *Meets CPCS graduation requirements for a high school general diploma.
- *Maintains all student records and transcripts.
- *Provides counseling and career guidance.
- *Provides correspondence with students out of the region via Skype, Zoom, or Facetime.

Program Options

Option #1

Meet with advisor one hour per week. Parent does not meet Washington State requirement for homeschooling.

Option #2

Meet with academic advisor less than one hour per week or monthly. Parent meets Washington State requirement for homeschooling.

General Costs

- *Application Fee: \$150.00
- *Continuous Re-enrollment Fee: \$150.00 per year/per student
- *New Family Enrollment Fee: \$300.00 one time.
- *Services/Processing Fee payable to the advisor: \$150.00 (per year/per student)
- *Advisor Fee: \$60 per hour
- *Tuition payable to CPCS: \$400.00 or \$600.00/year depending on the program option.
- *Two classes may be taken on campus for middle and high school students, with administrator approval/space permitting. Fee is 1/6 of on-campus tuition per class/per month. CPCS sports are available for IS students.
